



Lakes to visit in South East QLD

1. Lake Borumba, Imbil

Catch a fish from Lake Borumba off the shoreline, or from a family or a friend's boat.

2. Hinze Dam, Advance town

Learn the rich history about Hinze Dam with a walk along the dam wall and a visit to the Information Centre.

3. Lake Somerset, Kilcoy

Enjoy water sports? Try your hand at wakeboarding, water skiing or tubing on the lake.

4. Lake Wyaralong, Beaudesert

Take a four legged adventure on a horse around Lake Wyaralong or stop for a picnic BBQ at the Meebun Recreation Area.

5. Ewen Maddock Dam, Sunshine Coast

Cruise your mountain bike over 9km of multi-use trails that are shared between walkers, bike riders and horse riders. Visit the Ornamental Wetlands, on the southern side of the lake, to learn the important role our wetlands play in the water catchment story.

6. Lake Wivenhoe, Somerset region

Test your boating skills and sail on South East Queensland's largest water storage! Stop for a swim at Logan's Inlet or for a bite to eat at one of five picnic and BBQ areas.

7. Lake Baroon, Sunshine Coast hinterland

Enjoy the peace and quiet with a bushwalk at one of many trails around the lake, including the Martin Williams Walk, a stroll to Obi Obi Creek or the Sunshine Coast Hinterland Great Walk.

8. Lake Maroon, Burnett creek

Stay overnight in a camping ground at Lake Maroon after a big day of canoeing, kayaking or fishing.

9. Lake Samsonvale, North Pine River

Enjoy a picnic or bird watching at Lake Samsonvale.

10. Enoggera Reservoir, Enoggera

Take a paddle in a canoe or kayak at Enoggera Reservoir. Jump into the water for a swim in the designated swimming area to cool down.
